

National Sport Trust Fund – Manitoba Chapter Approved Project List

(As of June 14, 2010)

The National Sport Trust Fund (NSTF) is a philanthropic gift-giving program established through the Canadian Council of Provincial and Territorial Sport Federations (CCPTSF) for the development of amateur sport on a national level. The CCPTSF is a Registered Canadian Amateur Athletic Association (RCAAA) with the Canada Revenue Agency.

Below is a summarized listing of the eligible projects which have received approval to participate in the program with the NSTF-MB Chapter.

Sport Manitoba Community Development Project (Project # MB08-01)

- Project is raising funds to support the following purposes: Sport Alliances, Hosting Grants, Travel Assistance Grants, Sport Development Grants and Bilateral Sports development.

Winnipeg Rowing Club – WRC Dock System Replacement Project (Project # MB08-02)

- The WRC project is raising funds to replace and upgrade the club's dock system.

Junkyard Dogs Cycling Club – Birch Cycling Facility Development Project (Project # MB08-03)

- Junkyard Dogs club project is raising funds to assist with the further development of the birch facility, including maintaining and upgrading trail system, installing signage, creating trail maps, and assisting with annual operating costs.

Crescentwood Community Centre Boxing Club – National Athlete Development Project

(Project # MB08-04)

- The Crescentwood CC project is raising funds to assist athletes with travel and coaching support, along with providing performance enhancement services for the team.

Sport Manitoba - Sport for Life Centre (Project # MB09-01)

- The building and development of a Sport for Life Centre, based on the goal of building a more collaborative sport delivery system in the Province of Manitoba. The Sport for Life Centre presents an opportunity to incorporate a mix of sport heritage, high performance and community sport."It brings together sport administrators with practitioners creating a

critical mass of sport expertise and knowledge. This facilitates the crucial link between research, practice and education. The Centre will consist of two main areas: phase 1 office/admin space and phase 2 training/athletic space.

Chris McCubbins Inner City Schools Ski Program (Cross Country Ski Association of MB)
Formerly Get off Your Butt & Ski Project (Project # MB09-02)

- CCSAM is raising funds for the Chris McCubbins Inner City Schools Ski Program. The students come from six inner city area schools and participate in 13 weekly ski lessons at the Windsor Park Nordic Center over the winter.

Manitoba Basketball Hall of Fame (Project #MB09-03)

- The project's goal is to increase the Manitoba Basketball Hall of Fame's ability to promote and showcase the sport thru physical improvements to the Hall environment.

St James Rods Football Club – Redevelopment of Practice & Game Fields (Project #MB09-04)

- To support the development of athletes through the operations of the club including the redevelopment of game and practice fields. This scope of the project concentrates on the Game Field by enhancing the facilities for the players and spectators and developing a new Practice Field complete with lights.

Winnipeg Minor Basketball Foundation – Outdoor & Indoor Court Construction

(Project #MB09-05)

- WMBF is raising funds to develop and improve facilities to meet the increased demands from growing participation in basketball. They are currently working on their third facility project with plans for 2-3 more sites to be confirmed.

The Charleswood Broncos – First and Goal – Phase IV Installation of Field Lights

(Project #MB10-01)

- The project is to raise funds to develop a nationally recognized club over the next ten years. The proceeds will be used directly to pay for components of phase 4 or to pay back any loan that the club acquires to pay for this project. Field lights will provide field capacity that is key to expanded programming, high caliber training, participation in national and provincial activities, promoting our best athletes, providing the "Broncos Experience" and bringing the best athletes to football.
